



As the day progressed, the focus shifted


towards rejuvenating mind and body through the practice of yoga and meditation. Amidst the serene backdrop of nature, participants delved into the ancient disciplines, discovering the

Findings

After conducting a survey with a sample size of 300 individuals (Random Sampling method) out of a population of 3200 in K. Savaram village, several key findings have emerged. These findings shed light on various aspects of the community, providing valuable insights into its needs, preferences, and challenges. Through this survey, we aim to identify areas for improvement and develop targeted strategies to address the concerns of the villagers effectively.

Findings:

- **1. Awareness Gap:** There is a noticeable lack of awareness among the residents of K. Savaram village regarding the segregation of dry waste and wet waste. This was evident during the rally conducted as part of the NSS Special Camp, where volunteers had to actively engage in educating the community about proper waste management practices.
- **2. Community Engagement:** The involvement of villagers in the awareness rally was relatively low, indicating a need for greater community engagement in initiatives aimed at improving village infrastructure and environmental sustainability.
- **3. Youth Leadership Development:** The NSS Special Camp provided valuable opportunities for students to develop management and leadership skills. This highlights the potential for youth empowerment and capacity-building programs to contribute to the overall development of K. Savaram village.
- **4. Positive Response:** Despite the awareness gap, there was a positive response from both the village sarpanch, ward members, and college authorities towards the NSS team's efforts. This indicates a willingness to collaborate on community development initiatives.
- **5. Lack of Public Transportation:** The absence of APSRTC (Andhra Pradesh State Road Transport Corporation) bus service to K. Savaram village indicates a significant gap in public transportation infrastructure. Villagers heavily rely on private vehicles for their transportation needs, which may not be affordable or accessible to everyone.
- **6. High Speeding of Bikers:** It has been observed that bikers are moving at high speeds along the main street of K. Savaram village, posing a significant risk of accidents. Despite the presence of a few speed breakers, the speeding issue persists and increases the likelihood of road accidents.

Suggestions:

- **1. Continuous Awareness Campaigns:** Implement regular awareness campaigns on waste segregation and environmental conservation in K. Savaram village. These campaigns should involve various stakeholders, including local authorities, schools, and community leaders, to ensure widespread participation and understanding.
- **2. Youth Engagement Programs:** Establish ongoing programs aimed at engaging youth in community development activities. Encourage students to take on leadership roles and organize initiatives such as cleanliness drives, tree planting events, and educational workshops.
- **3.** Collaborative Efforts: Foster stronger partnerships between the college and the village authorities to implement sustainable development projects. This could include initiatives focused on improving sanitation facilities, promoting renewable energy sources, and enhancing access to healthcare services.
- **4. Capacity Building:** Provide training and workshops for villagers on waste management techniques, composting, and sustainable agriculture practices. Empower community members with the knowledge and skills needed to adopt environmentally friendly behaviors in their daily lives.
- **5. Feedback Mechanism:** Establish a feedback mechanism to assess the impact of initiatives and gather input from villagers on their needs and priorities. This will ensure that future programs are tailored to address specific challenges and preferences within the community.
- **6. Route Optimization:** Work with APSRTC authorities to optimize bus routes to ensure comprehensive coverage of K. Savaram village and nearby areas. Conduct surveys or consultations with villagers to determine the most convenient and frequented stops within the village.
- **7. Increase Awareness and Install More Speed Breakers:** Launch an awareness campaign among bikers and other road users to emphasize the importance of adhering to speed limits and practicing safe driving habits. Additionally, collaborate with local authorities to install more speed breakers strategically along the main street to deter speeding and ensure the safety of pedestrians and motorists.

By implementing these findings and suggestions, K. Savaram village can progress towards becoming a more sustainable and inclusive community, with active participation from all residents in shaping its future development.
