Theme-wise Guidelines were issued vide ref(2) including month-wise themes and action points. As part of the monthly thematic activities under Swachha Andhra initiatives and alignment with the focus of World Environmental Day(WED2025) is on avoid non essential plastics and related pollution. Accordingly the theme for July is **"Ending Plastic Pollution"**.

In this connection, all the Principals of Government Degree College are requested to conduct the following activities with focus on avoid non essential plastics and related pollution.

1. Conduct Awareness programs on use of essential and Non Essential Plastics.
 - Essential Plastics(needed for health,safety and functionality) ex:1 Medical equipment(syringes,IV bags, gloves. 2. Food Packaging 3.Water Storage containers 4. Electronic insulation 5.Safety helmets, Seat belts.
 - Non Essential Plastics(can be avoided or replaced):These are single use and decorative plastics .ex:1.Plastic carry bags (especially below 120 microns) 2.Straws,cutlery(spoons,forks) 3.Plastic Plates and glasses 4. Plastic Decorations 5. Packaging layers , plastic wrappers in festivals.
2. Conduct College-wise plastic collection drives
3. Conduct sessions on the impact of micro plastics in health and environment
 - Special focus on preventing micro plastics from entering the food chain and water bodies.
4. Create awareness on Resource Recovery(Recovering valuable materials or energy from waste before it is disposed),Recycling(Breaking down waste material and mark them as new products),Up cycling(Creatively reusing waste to make something more useful or beautiful)

Resource Recovery:

- Collect old notebooks/papers -send for paper pulping&reuse
- Compost-garden waste-used as a manure for college gardens
- Collect e-waste(old chargers,batteries)-Send to certified recyclers.

Recycling:

➤ Used Paper-recycle into new paper

Upcycling:

- Old Jeans or T Shirts-Convert into bags ,etc
- CD's-turned into wall art
- Broken Buckets/ mugs:used as a growing plants
- Old tyres : used as garden pots or seats in campus

5. Conduct Crafts Competition
6. Create recycling collection corner in the College Campus.
7. Start "Best from Waste" wall display etc
8. Conduct awareness drives through rallies,banners,posters and digital media.
9. Invite environmental experts to speak on plastic pollution and sustainable alternatives
10. Administer SASA-theme related Pledge
11. Perform skits or dramas on the ill effects of plastic in around the college
12. Create slogans with students like "Plastic Free Future"or "Beat Plastic Pollution"
13. Involve NSS,NCC,Eco Clubs to survey and document Plastic usage in canteens,hostels,classrooms etc
14. Conduct competition or exhibition on recycling plastic into creative products.
15. Collaborate with municipal authorities for proper disposal ,Recycling and Up cycling of collected plastic.

Hence all the Principals of Government and Private Aided Degree College are requested to implement the July SASA activities under the theme "**Ending Plastic Pollution**". The details of the activities shall be submitted in the **SASA APP** (developed by Swachha Andhra Corporation) on or before **5:00PM on 19-07-2025** and note that the APP will close automatically close after the deadline. 
