3.2 Detailed Event Descriptions

- **Samvidhan Hatya Divas (25 June 2025):** The Department of B.A. observed the 50th anniversary of the Emergency to educate students on its historical and constitutional significance. The event facilitated active student discussions on the vital importance of safeguarding democracy and freedom.
- **RTI Act Vicennial Celebrations (26–28 July 2025):** To celebrate 20 years of the Right to Information Act, the college conducted essay writing, elocution, debate, and quiz competitions. Our students also competed at the NRC-level on 1 August 2025, demonstrating their profound understanding of this vital citizen right.
- **National Vigilance Day (31 October 2025):** To promote integrity and ethical behaviour, students and staff collectively took the Integrity Pledge. The session focused on the importance of honesty, transparency, and accountability in preventing corruption and strengthening good governance.
- **National Constitution Day (26 November 2025):** A grand celebration was held to honour Dr. B.R. Ambedkar as the chief architect of the Constitution. The college community collectively read the Preamble aloud, reflecting on the core values of equality, justice, and dignity. Students were sensitized about fulfilling their duties as responsible citizens.
- **Ambedkar Vardhanti (6 December 2025):** The college observed the death anniversary of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar with solemn reverence. Faculty members recalled his ideals of social justice and his enduring relevance to Indian democracy, reaffirming our collective commitment to an egalitarian society.
- **Human Rights Day (10 December 2025):** The Principal and the Department of History addressed students on the historical significance of human rights. The programme successfully created awareness regarding human dignity, equality, and fundamental rights, inspiring students to uphold human values in their daily lives.
- **National Consumers Day (24 December 2025):** College-level and district-level competitions, including elocution and essay writing, were conducted to educate students on consumer rights, legal awareness, and market responsibilities.
- **Viksit Bharat Young Leaders Dialogue (9–12 January 2026):** Ms. Puppala Mounika represented the institution at the national-level dialogue in New Delhi. She presented innovative ideas on social inclusion and financial security for migrant workers, reflecting the core constitutional value of equity.
- **National Girl Child Day (24 January 2026):** The Women Empowerment Cell (WEC) and Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) organized educational competitions centred on women's rights and child welfare, alongside sessions on the POCSO and POSH Acts and anti-ragging awareness.

- **Social Justice (Samajika Nyayam) Lecture (20 February 2026):** A special, thought-provoking lecture was organized featuring guest speaker Sri DVVS Varma, who emphasized the crucial role of social justice in building an inclusive society. The session highlighted constitutional values, democratic principles, and the role of education in empowering marginalized groups.
- **Pedal for Freedom (February 2026):** The college warmly hosted the “Pedal for Freedom” cycling team—11 dedicated students undertaking a 600-kilometre ride to promote vital social awareness themes. The interaction inspired our students to actively commit to community causes.
